
The **visa policy of Nepal** is relatively liberal, allowing citizens of almost all nations to obtain a tourist visa on arrival. Citizens of India do not need a visa for Nepal because the 1950 Indo-Nepal Treaty of Peace and Friendship allows free movement of people and goods between the two nations.

In January 2014 Nepal introduced online visa application system.^{[1][2]}

Visa on arrival

With the exception of eleven states, every foreign national can obtain a tourist visa on arrival in Nepal. There is a choice of multiple entry visas for 15, 30 or 90 days. All citizens of SAARC member states are granted a tourist visa for 30 days at no cost.^[3]

Visa in advance

Citizens of the following states are required to request a visa before arrival in Nepal:^[4]

- Afghanistan
- Cameroon
- Ethiopia
- Ghana
- **I**raq
- Liberia
- Nigeria
- Palestinian territories
- Somalia
- Swaziland
- Zimbabwe
